Through a network of 30 partner agencies and 45 Critical Need Programs, United Way of Aiken County and its partners serve over 150,000 people in Aiken County. Critical Needs programs range from assistance to elderly, children, victims of abuse, help with vocational training, addiction counseling, afterschool programs and many other services. These critical needs programs fall into the four critical need areas: Education, Health, Income and Assistance In Crisis. Each year our partner agencies submit funding requests for the critical need programs they run. These applications are thoroughly vetted by our Care Councils, who then recommend funding which is approved by our Executive Committee and Board of Directors. In 2024 United Way of Aiken County provided over \$1.3 Million in funding to 45 critical need programs that serve our community.

# THE YEAR IN REVIEW








#### Partner Agencies and Critical Need Programs
