OUTPUTS

Activities

- Attend civic meetings to discuss impact of mental illness in our community.
- Facilitate training for individuals on suicide prevention.
- Curriculum to Aiken County schools for their use.
- Communicate with Aiken County Coroner regarding suicide statistics.
- Reproduce materials to be used in training.
- Conduct confidential depression screens and refer as needed.
- Held monthly Suicide Bereavement support group.
- Hold monthly Suicide Coalition meetings for suicide prevention.

Participants

- People seeking help through our referrals to the CCR.
- Individuals seeking support for themselves, friends or family member call our agency.
- Individuals seeking education/preparedness on mental health issues.
- Families and loved one's that have had a person in their life complete suicide.
- Community and school age children participate in community education events.

OUTCOMES

- 2022: 41 suicides occurred.
- 1,300 students were trained in Signs of Suicides prevention curriculum.
- 16,000 website visitors and over 24,000 phone referrals.
- 104 suicide saves by phone.
- Annual Suicide Prevention Summit we had 300 people attendance.
- Out of the Darkness Walk was held and more than 550 were in attendance.
- 120 people came to the monthly Support Bereavement groups we have added another faith-based group lead by a minister but hosed by us.
